## Keeping Children Safe –

### A Shared Responsibility

At Hensingham Primary School, safeguarding is everyone’s business. It means protecting children from abuse, harm, and neglect—and creating an environment where every child can thrive. This responsibility doesn’t rest solely with school staff. As the *Keeping Children Safe in Education (2025)* guidance reminds us:

*“Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone’s responsibility.”*

Parents, carers, volunteers, and visitors all play a part. The *Children Act (1989)* emphasises the importance of prioritising children’s welfare, stating:

*“The welfare of the child is paramount.”*

And under the *Education Act (2002)*, schools must promote the development and wellbeing of pupils as part of their statutory duties.

### What you can do to help:

- Be alerted to signs a child may be struggling emotionally or physically
- Encourage respectful and open communication with children
- Follow our school’s safeguarding procedures carefully
- Share any concerns—however small—with a designated safeguarding lead

The *Working Together to Safeguard Children (2023)* guidance calls for strong partnerships across education, family, and community services to ensure effective safeguarding. Together, we can build a network of protection and positivity around every child.
